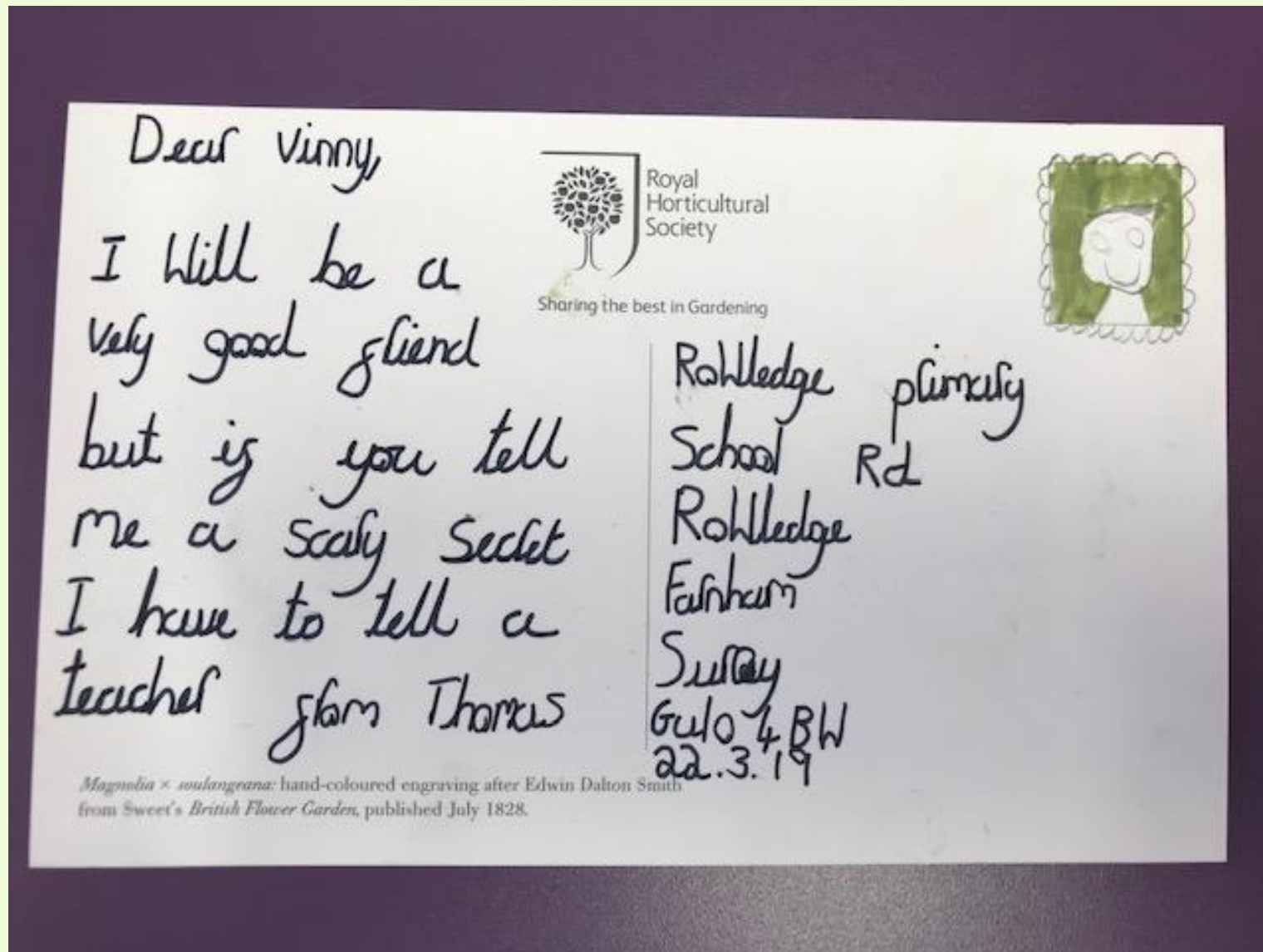


Remember:
