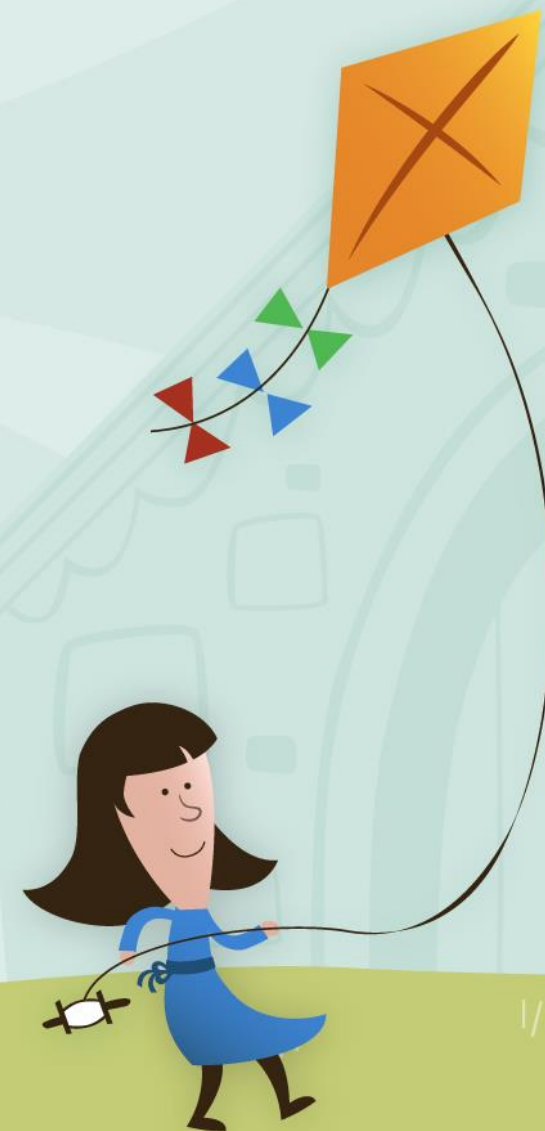

Consider the scenarios on the next few slides.



Scenario 1



Every day Tom moves Freddie's bag from his peg and he also trips him up on the football pitch quite regularly. Max sees this and asks Tom to stop. He doesn't. What could Max do?



Scenario 2



George finds a picture on the Internet that is for grown ups and sends it to Harry. Harry knows it isn't for children, but doesn't want to get George in trouble. What could Harry do?



Scenario 3



Megan tells Charlotte that her dad's friend makes her feel uncomfortable when he cuddles her and she doesn't like him doing this. Charlotte doesn't like hearing this and worries about Megan. What could Charlotte do?



Scenario 4



Jess is talking to an online friend that she hasn't met in person. The online friend asks Jess to send them a picture of her looking pretty. Jess sends the picture. Then Jess worries it wasn't the right things to do and tells her friend Izzy. What could Izzy do?



Scenario 5



Amelia is worried about her friend Rebecca. Rebecca says that she is hurting herself at home. Amelia doesn't understand what this means, but it makes her feel a bit scared. What could Amelia do?



Scenario 6



James notices that Freddie is talking a lot about his clothes and how he looks. He also sees that Freddie is leaving most of his lunch. This happens a few times and James doesn't know what to do. What could James do?



Scenario 7



Will is friends with Leo on-line. They have been gaming for over a year so they know each other well. Leo says that Will is his best friend and he wants to meet him. Leo says it would be best if they do it without anyone else around. Will tells his friend Ethan about Leo and says they're going to meet up. What could Ethan do?



Scenario 8



Ben is worried about his friend Sam. Sam doesn't seem happy and he keeps saying he 'hates' groups of people, like some of the children that live in the caravans down the road. He seems really angry. What could Ben do?



Scenario 9



Jess is in the same class as Matthew and they have always been friends. Matthew starts texting Jess messages that are confusing, saying that he doesn't think she is very nice. Matthew says that Jess is ugly and annoying. Jess asks him to stop, but he doesn't. Jess tells Amy. What could Amy do?



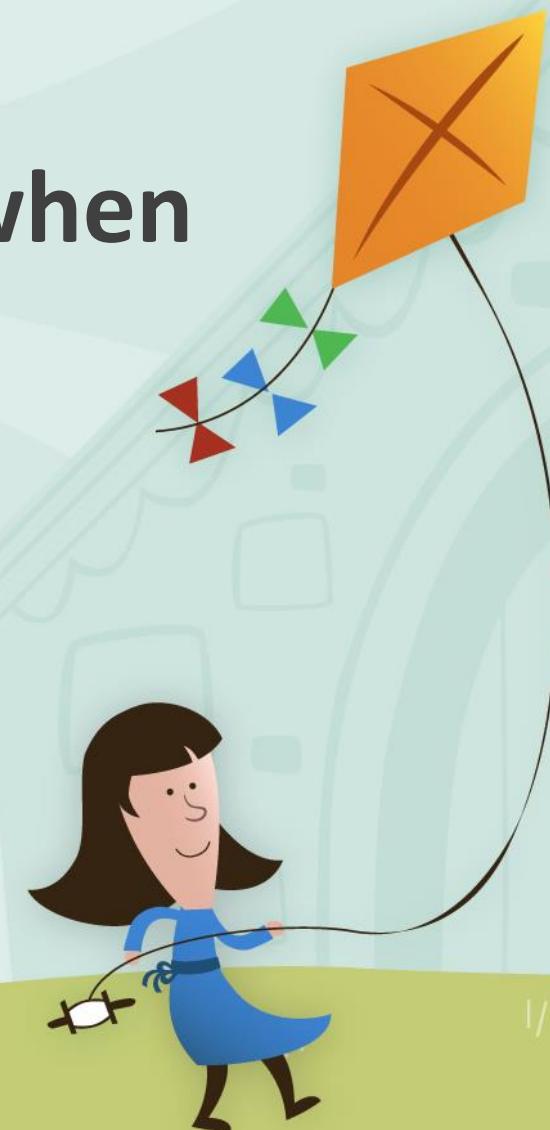
Scenario 10



Oliver has been talking to Will about watching things on YouTube and about joining a group who might be able to change the world. He says he's spoken to someone who wants him to help. Will isn't sure about this and feels a bit scared. What could Will do?



Why don't people tell a trusted adult when they are worried about a friend?

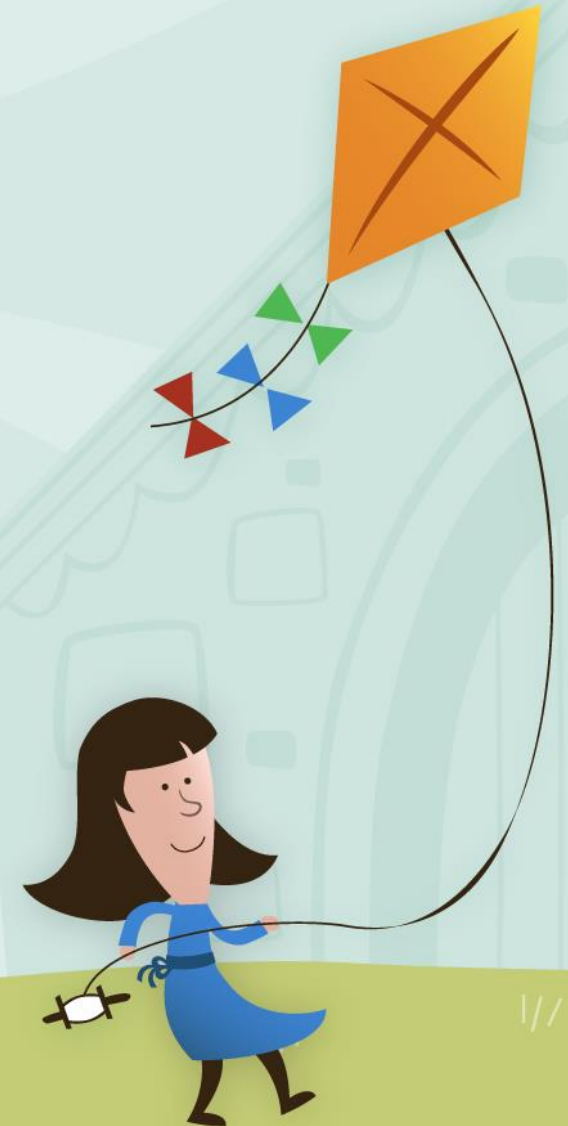


Why don't people tell a trusted adult when they are worried about a friend?
