

# Maths facts from Year 1



*Learning these Maths facts from Year 1 will really help you in Year 2.*

1	You should be able to count to 100
2	You should be able to read and write numbers up to 20 in words
3	You should be able to recognise and name a rectangle, square, circle, triangle, cube, cuboid, pyramid and sphere
4	You should be able to tell the time to the nearest half an hour
5	There are 12 months in a year (January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, December)
6	There are seven days in a week (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday)
7	You should be able to talk about time using words like: before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening
8	You should recognise these coins: 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1, £2
9	You should recognise these notes: £5, £10, £20
10	+ means 'add'
11	- means 'subtract'
12	= means 'equals'
13	You should be able to compare things using words like: lengths and heights (long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/half); mass or weight (heavy/light, heavier than, lighter than); capacity/volume (full/empty, more than, less than, quarter) and time (quicker, slower, earlier, later)
14	You should be able to compare things using words like: 'equal', 'more than', 'less than', 'greater', 'fewer', 'most', 'least'
15	You should know your number bonds to all the numbers up to 10 (so given a 3, the 'number bond to 7' would be 4 as $3+4=7$ )
16	You should know your number bonds to 20
17	Doubling a number means 'two of them', 'multiply by 2' or 'add another one on' i.e. double 6 is 12 as $6+6=12$
18	You should know what double any number is up to 10
